CHISPA Scholarships

CHISPA funds scholarships for students whose families live in CHISPA homes or apartments. The scholarships are for students attending Hartnell College and California State University at Monterey Bay (CSUMB). A scholarship administered by the Community Foundation for Monterey County (CFMC) is available for any college or trade education program. CHISPA has awarded 83 scholarships totaling over \$87,000 since 2005!

This fall, two students at Hartnell College, six students at California State University Monterey Bay, and three students through the Community Foundation for Monterey County were awarded a total of \$14,202 in CHISPA scholarships.

East Garrison Apartments County of Monterey

The construction of East Garrison Apartments is underway! Our subcontractors are pouring foundations, installing infrastructure, and framing the buildings! We anticipate a May 2023 completion.

We send out a monthly newsletter to provide updates on construction progress and the application process to rent apartments.

Financing partners are Enterprise Community Investments, JP Morgan Bank, The State of California Department of Housing and Community Development Joe Serna Farmworker Program, the County of Monterey, and Central California Community Energy (3CE). The Housing Authority of the County of Monterey will provide Project Based Vouchers for 15 of the apartments.

The development will provide housing for families earning under 60% Adjusted Median Income for Monterey County. 43 of the 66 apartments will be dedicated to households working in agriculture.

CHISPA will offer after-school programs, computer classes, and other activities for the residents, as well provide free basic Internet for each apartment.
