Monterey Bay Aquarium's Free to Learn Program

CHISPA is excited to announce its partnership with the Monterey Bay Aquarium's Free to Learn Program. The Free to Learn Program provides complimentary group admission to eligible nonprofit organizations and to government agencies serving low-income and historically-excluded children, adults and families.

This Free to Learn program at CHISPA stemmed from Communities Learn about Marine Science Program, in which participants in CHISPA's Teen Leadership Program explored the Monterey Bay Aquarium, guided by education staff members.

Teens and families enjoyed a fun, hands-on introduction to some of Monterey Bay's most precious habitats in an interactive classroom setting. Transportation and lunch was provided by the Aquarium to all participants.



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Alfred Diaz-Infante Apartments, County of Monterey, close to City of Marina

Construction continues of the 66-unit family apartment complex on two parcels of land in the East Garrison Subdivision in County of Monterey, near City of Marina. We anticipate completion of buildings before year-end, subject to PG&E setting meters on schedule. We received about 2,000 applications and will begin to process them soon.

Castroville Oaks, Unincorporated Monterey County near City of Castroville

This mixed-income development is anticipated to include 90 homes and 125 apartments. The subdivision will be located on 44 acres of land near Castroville Boulevard that is zoned high-density residential. This development is in pre-development phase.

King City Apartments, King City

CHISPA purchased five parcels in the Mills Ranch subdivision in King City to accommodate 40 apartments. We have secured development entitlements from the City of King and have funding commitments from the State of California HCD/ Joe Serna program and the Department of Developmental Services program. We have applied for low-income housing tax credits for this development.

Vista de la Terraza Apartments, City of Salinas

CHISPA will renovate this 40-unit property in 2024. We received a commitment of permanent financing from the State of California Portfolio Reinvestment Program and have applied for a construction loan. We intend to construct a retaining wall in the parking lot, replace walkways, remove old balconies and upgrade kitchens and bathrooms.

St. George Apartments, City of Salinas

We are applying to the City of Salinas for entitlements to subdivide a piece of property owned by the St. George Parish at 98 Kip Drive. We have an option to purchase this property after it is subdivided.

The St. George church is located on the parcel, and we plan to rezone a portion of the property for residential use and to construct 36 senior apartments on the site.

Alta Street Parcel, Gonzales, CA

CHISPA has an option to purchase a small parcel on Alta Street where we plan to develop affordable senior apartments or small rental homes.
